Part VI General conditions for permission to import animal by-products for educational, research og diagnostic purposes

- 1 It is forbidden to use animal by-product for other purposes than stated in the permission from the Norwegian Food Safety Authority.
- 2 Consignment from third countries must be transported directly from the Veterinary Border Inspection Post to the user/importer.
- 3 The consignment must be accompanied by a trade document² issued by the consignor with the following information:
 - Description of the material and animal art of origin
 - By-product category
 - Quantity
 - Place of origin and place of dispatch of the by-product
 - Consignors name and address.
 - Consignee and / or users name and address
 - Reference number in the permission from the Norwegian Food Safety Authority
- 4 The user must take all necessary precautions to prohibit dispersion of contagious diseases to humans and animals by acting in compliance with good laboratory practice.
- 5 Unless kept for reference use, the rest- material and eventually other products of the material, must be disposed of as waste by incineration, by pressure sterilization and subsequent disposal, or, under certain conditions, by another destruction method that is given permission to use².
- 6 The user must take notes of the receptions and use of the material. This register must contain information given under point 3 including date and method of disposal of the rest- material and eventually products of this.
- 7 The consignment must be marked "For research and diagnostic purposes" when transported.
- 8 The importer shall be registered as Special user of animal by-products with the code UDER.
