

DECLARATION OF CONSENT - PETS

Purpose of this declaration

This declaration is to be used when the conditions for import/transport of pets to Norway are not fulfilled at the time of entry at the border. The document informs about the different options one can choose amongst when rules and regulations regarding import of pets to Norway are not fulfilled. This document will serve as a declaration of consent to cover all the expenses that will arise as a consequence of the option selected.

This form will also provide information about the decisions the Norwegian Food Safety Authority might impose on the owner of the animal when the animal does not fulfil the requirements for admission to Norway, and none of the volunteer options are chosen.

Conditions for admission/ Import requirements of pet to Norway

The requirements for bringing pets to Norway are laid down in the regulation of July 1st 2004 no. 1105 concerning animal health requirements for non-commercial movement of pets. This regulation implements the commission decision 2003/998/EC in Norway.

The following requirements for import is considered to be unfulfilled at the time of border control (*tick of in the right column*)

Identification of animal from EEC, cf. § 4	
Pet passport/documentation for import from third countries, cf. § 6	
Valid vaccination for movement within EEC, cf. § 4	

Valid as from 1st of May 2013

Valid vaccination for import from third countries, cf. §7, 1. section	
Valid blood sample for rabies antibody titre, cf. § 7, 2. section (Applies only to pets from non-listed third countries)	
Valid treatment against echinococcosis, cf. § 4b	
Identification of animal from third countries, cf. § 5.

Overview of different options

The following options are available (*tick of in the right column*):

The animal(s) is/are kept/isolated until the animal health/ID requirements are fulfilled. This also includes the opportunity to have the animal(s) kept at one of the two quarantine stations (Vestberg or Eidsvoll).	
The animal(s) will be returned to the country of origin (where the animal(s) started its/their journey).	
The animal(s) is/are to be euthanized.	

Declaration about liability of costs

When the requirements for admission of pets to Norway are not fulfilled, the owner is liable for the costs that arise due to the breach of Norwegian regulations.

The owner is made aware of the above mentioned different options that are available when the requirements are not met. He/she hereby agree to cover the costs that arise as a consequence of this irregularity and as a direct result of the choices he/she has ticked off, by signing this document.

Payment of the housing/isolation shall be done in advance when the animal is collected by the company arranging the housing/isolation. Payment of any accrued expenses shall be done no later than at the time of return of the animal to the owner.

If the requirements for importation/transport of pet(s) to Norway are not fulfilled at the time of border control, the Norwegian Food Safety Authority can decide to euthanize the animal(s), cf. regulation of July 1st 2004 no. 1105 and commission decision 2003/998/EC article 14.

Depending on the situation decisions will be made by the local office of NFSA or by the national duty officer (outside normal business hours).
